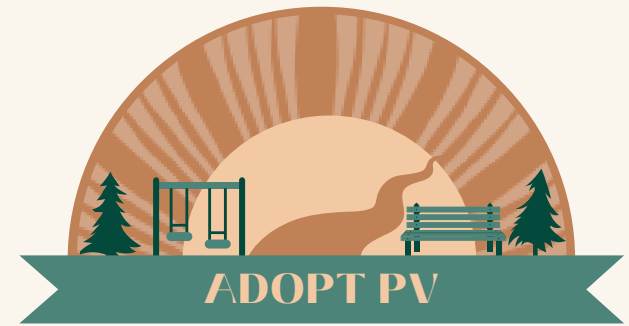
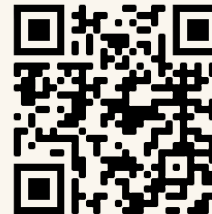

WHAT IS ADOPT PV?

The Adopt PV program allows participants to showcase their pride in the community. Adopt PV is designed to educate the public through an informal program to increase citizen awareness and pride by preserving clean and safe parks and trails for everyone.

Adopt PV works not as a substitute for the Parks and Recreation Department's duties, but to enhance the Town of Prescott Valley's parks and trails by providing ongoing volunteer support.

BENEFITS:

- It's a great way for your group to spend quality time together and feel good about what you're doing
- Your organization's name will be acknowledged on a sign at your park or trail
- You will benefit from the satisfaction of knowing that you are improving your favorite community space
- It will not only better those specific community sites, but the Town of Prescott Valley as a whole
- It will give your group a chance to have a hands-on role in keeping our community clean and beautiful

WHO CAN ADOPT?

- Individuals
- Neighborhood associations
- Civic groups
- Religious organizations
- Service organizations
- Schools (school groups and teams)
- Businesses
- Any other community organizations throughout the Town of Prescott Valley

COMMITMENT:

- A minimum of 2 hours work once a month
- Report intended monthly work days through the end of the calendar year
- Renew adopter status each calendar year
- Report graffiti and vandalism via provided reporting forms
- Ensure each and every group member or volunteer signs the provided waiver
- Maintain communication with the Parks and Recreation Department

RECOGNITION

Individuals and groups are recognized on social media and with an acknowledgement sign installed at the adopted site

ADOPTER DUTIES:

Adopter's primary and overall duty is to enhance maintenance and beautification efforts within a park or trail in order to create an unpolluted environment for the community.

Cleaning duties may include:

- Trash pickup
- Weeding/raking
- Sweeping shelters
- Cleaning picnic tables
- Graffiti reporting
- Vandalism reporting

Optional special projects may include:

- Painting projects
- Graffiti removal
- Planting native plants

DEPARTMENT DUTIES:

- Determine site to be adopted
- Erect a sign at the adopted park or trail that displays the name of the group or individual
- Supply the group/organization with garbage bags and reporting forms (tools/ equipment when requested)
- Remove filled garbage bags from the area as soon as practical
- Provide instruction and supervision as required for special projects
